












### Seven Major Index Crimes/Grand Larceny




### Seven Major Index Crimes/G.L.A.




#### **Youth Crimes**


#### **Top Moving Violations**

#### Cars/ Motorcycles/ Trucks

- 1. <u>575</u> Speed Over Posted Limit (Driving Over 25 MPH Unless otherwise posted.)
- 2. <u>316</u> Disobey Traffic Device- Pavement Markings (When a Diver Ignores a line, arrow or other marking on the Road)
- 3. <u>257</u> Failed To Yield to Vehicles / Pedestrian (Failing to Yield right of way to other Vehicles or Pedestrians in roadway)
- 4. <u>199</u> Improper Turns (Making Right/Left Turn from any lane other then designated turning lane)
- 5. <u>182</u> NYC Red Light (Proceeding through the stop point after the traffic device has transitioned to Solid Red)
- 6. <u>180</u> Unlicensed Operator (Driving without a valid drivers license)
- 7. <u>172</u> Improper Right Turn at Intersection (Failing to make Right Turn from the most right-hand lane)

#### **Top Moving Violations**

#### Bicycle /Scooter

- 1. 361 Bike Failed to Yield to Vehicle / Pedestrian
  - (Failing to Yield right of way to other Vehicles or Pedestrians in roadway)
- 2. <u>326</u> Bike Failed to Stop- Red Light (Proceeding through the stop point after the traffic device has transitioned to Solid Red)
- 3. <u>120</u> Disobey Traffic Device while Operating Bicycle (When a Cyclist fails to follow traffic sign, signal or pavement markings)
- 4. 29 Bike/Skate on sidewalk-NYC (Operating a bike or Skateboard on a public sidewalk over the age of 12)
- 5. <u>24</u> Bicycle Fail to Yield right of way to Pedestrian Crosswalk (Cyclist fails to allow pedestrian to proceed through intersection)

## 17<sup>th</sup> Precinct Summons Activity Quality Of Life Summons



- 1. 804 Unlawful Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages
  - (Consuming Alcoholic Beverages in open view of the pubic)
- 2. 301 Unlawful Bicycle Riding on Sidewalk (Operating a Bike on Public Sidewalk over the age of 12)
- 3. <u>173</u> Operation of Motorized Scooter NYC (Operating Motorized Scooter in NYC without proper License, Registration and Insurance)
- 4. <u>170</u> Failure to Comply with Bicycle Riding Restriction (Breaking any of the laws that regulate Bicycles in the city. Examples On Sidewalk, Fail to Yield, Riding against Traffic, Running Red Lights.)
- 5. <u>125</u> Fail to Display License and/ or Plate (Any License plate that is Missing, Improperly Displayed, Mutilated, Covered or Dirty so it cannot be clearly seen)

# BECOME POLICE POLICE POLICE OFFICER 17th Precinct


- · Patrol housing developments, residential, and commercial areas

- Maintain order at parades, festivals, street fairs, and other special events
- Patrol houses of worship
- · Assist in crime prevention activities
- · Perform traffic control at motor vehicle accidents and fire scenes
- · Perform various other non-enforcement duties

As part of the auxiliary police training course, candidates are trained in self-defense tactics, CPR and first aid, patrol techniques, the New York State Penal Law, and much more.

The auxiliary program is a great opportunity to get an up-close look at law enforcement. For some, it is a stepping stone to a great career in the NYPD. For others, the auxiliary program provides an opportunity to give back to the community while pursuing other careers.
